She explained that anyone whose pension is over \$23,000 is only getting a partial COLA because in 2011 Governor LePage pushed for a reduction in the base of the COLA is computed on and reduced the COLA cap from 4% to 3% in order to cut taxes. Crystal encouraged us to contact the appropriations committee to give retirees a full COLA and add it to the base amount used to compute future COLA increases. Our pensions are not keeping up with inflation driving more retirees into low income or poverty. Tell Legislature's they need to make and implement a plan to correct the terrible changes made in 2011.
- >. Cindy Peters spread Sunshine through sending out 55 cards since September for a variety of occasions and support. She also continues to research the history of AREA. Sue Cornelius gave some assistance.
